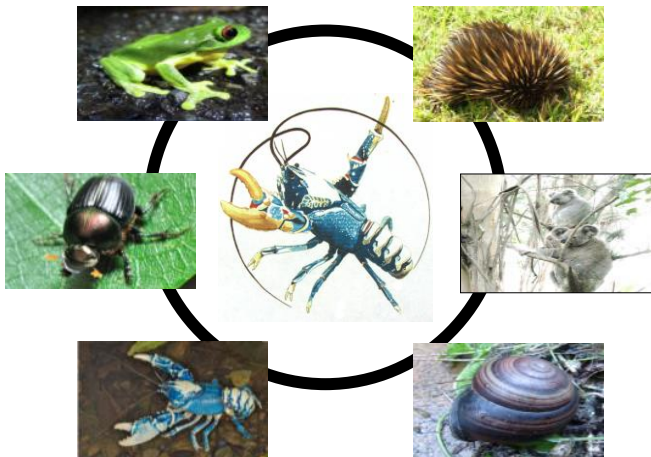
The emblem of the Association is the Lamington Spiny Crayfish (*Euastacus sulcatus*), endemic to Lamington Plateau.
